RCIA: TODAY WE CELEBRATE THE RITE OF ACCEPTANCE

Have you ever been intrigued by a travel brochure or the travel section of the Sunday newspaper? They lay before us all the marvels and wonders of distant and different lands. They may show us places and things that we've never seen; they hint at adventures that can't fully be described. Usually we spend a minute or an hour imagining what the journey might be like and then we turn the page or set the brochure down.

Those who come to us to find out about the Catholic church begin with a period of inquiry. The period of inquiry might be compared to reading a travel brochure. What kind of journey might this be? What might we encounter on the way? Where might we end up? These are important questions, but asking them is not the same thing as taking the journey.

The Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens—celebrated at the end of the period of inquiry—is something like sign-up day. At this liturgy, the inquirers who have asked the questions and now are ready to embark on the journey arrive at our door. We greet them and ask them what they want. They want what we told them that we could help them discover: faith, baptism, eternal life. We mark them with the cross, for this is the sign of all who are on this journey. We give them the holy scriptures: It is the guidebook that we use on the way. We promise to be with them on this trip, for we are still on it ourselves. And we give them wise guides—sponsors, catechists, pastors and many others—to surround them and support them as they learn the ways of the road.

Any good travel agent will tell you that she or he cannot guarantee how a journey will end, or what exactly will happen along the way. We can't say, either, what will happen along this way. But in faith we can say that if we and those we invite on this journey are faithful to the one who has called us to make it, then the end of the journey will be more marvelous than we imagined at the onset.

On Sunday Oct. 5, Troy Rogers and Carlos Arroyo are receiving this rite. Please pray for these persons who are embarking on an incredible journey.

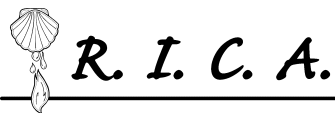

Youth Ministry/LIFE TEEN

LIFE Nights are catechetical meetings that immediately follow the Youth Mass on Sunday evening from 7:15 - 8:45 PM and take place in the parish hall unless otherwise noted. Teens in preparation for confirmation are expected to attend most nights.

Tonight: launches our semester theme of educational nights, where the focus is the Person of Christ. "A River Runs Through It" is about our response to God's free gift of Himself. This night will provide teens with the definition of faith and the role the Church plays in our faith.

Next Week: Oktoberfest – No LIFE Night. Youth Ministry hosts the Soda Booth

10/19 – Prove it!: this night gives teens a safe environment to ask questions and express doubts while giving them some of the main arguments to prove the existence of God.

10/26 – Pray the Vote: WHOLE COMMUNITY EVENT – all are welcome. This night will use the upcoming election to illustrate the importance of and our call to "faithful citizenship." Also addressed will be how to integrate our faith in making decisions on important issues.

Inspiration

When LIFE TEEN combines thrilling rides and intense worship, hearts are enlivened and souls ignited. Six flags may provide the entertainment, but LIFE TEEN provides the real attractions: the Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, praise and worship, powerful Catholic speakers and entertainers. Inspiration is more than your "ordinary" youth rally; it's an extraordinary encounter with Christ. Come and "Pray As Hard As You Play" this year at Inspiration on Saturday November 8. Spots are limited, flyers and release forms are now available, Cost is \$50, and includes admission to the park and transportation. Blood Drive

Pope John Paul II called the donation of blood "an act of concrete solidarity." During the summer, supply of units of blood in hospitals gets significantly depleted. 30-hour FOOD FAST

This year high school teens have an opportunity to participate in a unique, urban-retreat experience here at St. Linus on November 1-2. Through prayer, reflection activities, talks from missionaries, group projects, and learning opportunities, participants will investigate the link between hunger, migration and food security. We will use the lens of our Catholic Social Teaching to help us understand how these complex issues are interconnected.

Fasting will be the main form of prayer throughout the entire event, and during the weekend participants will drink only water and juice. The event will start with check-in on Saturday at 3 PM. We will break the fast with Eucharist celebrated at the LIFE TEEN Mass on Sunday evening, and conclude with a humble meal following the liturgy. We encourage the community to be involved in this event and participate however you can. We encourage those who are able to fast with us, and join us for dinner. Flyers, permission slips and more information will be available in the coming weeks. LIFE TEEN challenges teens and adults of our community to "Face the Fast."

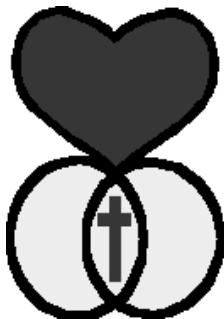
