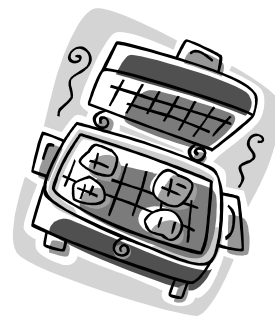

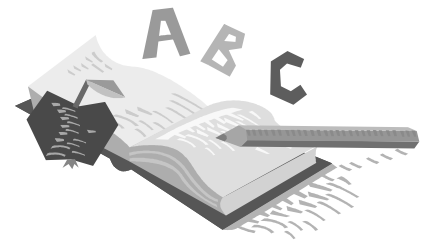

"The Year of St. Paul"

Commemorating the 2,000th anniversary of the Saint's birth.

St. Peter and St. Paul; Pillars of the Church

As early as the year 258, there is evidence of a tradition of celebrating the solemnities of both St. Peter and St. Paul on the same day. Our current liturgical calendar sets aside June 29th to celebrate this Solemnity honoring these two great saints. This is actually when the Pauline year will come to a close. When I was asked to write an article on St. Paul I was taken to write something about the relationship between him and Peter. These two great preachers and missionaries are together the founders of the See of Rome through their preaching and ministry and ultimately their martyrdom. Talk about heroes! Petrine and Pauline traditions are the fundamental cornerstone that influences what we do in ministry.

We know that Peter, formerly named Simon, was a fisherman and was introduced to Jesus by his brother Andrew. It was from Jesus himself that he received the name Cephas, (Petrus in Latin), which means "Rock"; a perfect name for the one whose mission was to be the head of the apostles and the first Pope. Peter was the first to recognize Jesus was "The Messiah", the first to pledge his life until death, the first to defend him in many instances. Yet, he was also very often the first one to make mistakes, revealing his human weaknesses and lack of faith. Peter's role as head of the Apostles is made very clear in the Acts of the Apostle where we see that he is clearly the leader of the church and the one entrusted with confirming that all followers keep the true faith.

It was Barnabas who introduced Saul to the Apostles and convinced them that he had changed his ways and become a true disciple of Christ. Now, Saul (Paul) never actually had the opportunity to meet Jesus during his public life. For this reason, 3 years after he was blinded on the road to Damascus, he decided that he should go and consult Jesus' first Disciples, those whom he had personally chosen. Paul went up to Jerusalem to get to know Peter and "remained with him for fifteen days" (Gal. 1:18). It is then that Paul learned much more about Jesus' earthly life.

So, how does Paul fit in with Peter and the rest of the apostles? Saint Paul, not originally a member of the twelve apostles that were chosen by Jesus, describes them as the foundation, the stones on which the Church was built and he considers himself the last and "least of the apostles, not fit to be called an apostle (1 Corinthians 15:9). Since he had persecuted God's church, he expresses his unworthiness to be considered an Apostle on par with those who had preceded him; but God's grace within him was not in vain (1Cor. 15:10) This affirmation of divine grace unites Paul with the first witnesses of Christ's Resurrection: "Whether then it was I or they, so we preach and so you believed" (1 Cor. 15:11) It is important to see how they were one in their proclamation of the Gospel. Although, in many cases, it sounds as though Paul had to defend himself against his opponents saying both they and I preach the same faith, the same Gospel of Jesus Christ who died and is risen and who gives himself in the most Holy Eucharist.



In some traditional Icons, Peter and Paul are shown embracing, sharing the kiss of peace. The truth is, they didn't always agree. However, they both worked tirelessly for Christ, bringing people from completely different backgrounds into one Church; Peter, the Apostle to the Jews and Paul, the Apostle to the Gentiles. The conversion of Gentiles was of great concern to the Apostles who believed that only Jews could become Disciples of Christ and that all must be circumcised. They called Paul back to Jerusalem to explain at the first Church meeting, called the Council of Jerusalem. During this meeting, it was decided that because Christ had come to save all people, the Church would not require disciples to become Jews before joining the Church. For this reason, Paul became known as the Apostle to the Gentiles. Another confrontation between Peter and Paul is known as the Antioch incident. At that time circumcised Jewish Christians could not sit at the same table with a Gentile Christian. It was considered impure. Peter, at the outset, shared meals with both. That is until the arrival of other Christians sent by James. It was then that Peter, who had previously eaten with the Gentiles, withdrew and separated himself from them for fear of the Jewish Christians. He was concealing what he truly believed. For this, Paul, become very angry at Peter and confronted him: "I opposed him to his face because he clearly was wrong" (Gal 2:11). Eventually a compromise was reached protecting the existence of the mixed communities. This incident bears witness to the integrity of Paul who would not allow for any adaptations of the truth of the Gospel.

We see that both men were frail human beings like us but they were able to accomplish great things in the name of our Lord Jesus. May we show the same passion, fervor and love for the Gospel as did St. Peter and Paul, these two great pillars of the Church.
