Mustard Seed Children left without a Home

Martha's House in Kingston Jamaica, home to thirty children with HIV/AIDS, burned to the ground Monday night, March 16th.

We are grateful that all of the children and caregivers were able to escape from the burning building. This was in large part due to the help of many people from the local community who came to our assistance.

A caregiver and security guard were injured and are expected to recover fully. Our children, many of whom are under five years old are very confused and are suffering from stress. They have lost their home and all of their belongings. We are mobilizing local volunteers to spend time with the children in order to reassure them that they are safe. The children have been taken to two of our homes in the area, Matthew 25:40 and Mary's Child, as we look for permanent housing.

Although we have not yet received a full report from the Fire Marshall, the fire is believed to have been caused by a short from the electrical pole outside of the home.

As is often true in disasters such as these, our immediate need is for funds and goods to replace what the children have lost. To donate funds online, please visit www.mustardseed.com.

WHAT IS TAIZE?

The **Taizé Community** is an ecumenical Christian monastic order in Taizé, Burgundy, France. It is comprised of a little over 100 brothers who come from Catholic, Orthodox and Protestant traditions. Over 100,000 young people from around the world make pilgrimages to Taizé each year for prayer, Bible study, sharing, and communal work.



The community, though Western European in origin, seeks to welcome people and traditions from across the globe. This is reflected in the music and prayers where songs are sung in many languages, and increasingly include chants and icons from the Eastern Orthodox tradition. The music emphasizes simple phrases, usually lines from Psalms or other pieces of Scripture, repeated and sometimes also sung in canon. The repetition is intended to aid meditation and prayer. Here at St. Linus, our Music Ministry will lead us in this form of Prayer while the church is lit only by candle light using the Cross as our main focus.

In many places across the world, ecumenical prayers using music from Taizé are organized by people, young and old, who have been in touch with the community. The community's website provides reflections, prayers, and songs for use in local prayers. This is how we at Linus have planned for this service. Check it out if you have time.

OUR LENTEN JOURNEY 2009: Praying, Fasting and Almsgiving

Praying: Stations of the Cross every Friday of Lent: 7:00 pm in English and 7:45 in Spanish. (Except 1st and 3rd Fridays; Bilingual Stations of the Cross at 7pm followed by mass)

Fasting: Throughout the Lenten season we fast in many ways, from food, from harmful practices, from gossip or from using a sharp tongue. We fast within the liturgy itself by not singing the Alleluia or the Gloria. We fast visually with the sparseness of our church decor. The obligatory days of fasting from food during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence, we abstain from eating red meat and poultry. Unless hindered by health reasons, all over the age of 14 are obligated to abstain from meat on Fridays. In observing this weekly day of abstinence we commit ourselves to journey as Christ's Body. You are welcome to come to our weekly Lenten dinners here at St. Linus every Friday of Lent in the parish hall beginning at 5:00 p.m.

Almsgiving: "My Lenten Offering" cards: At the doors of the church you will find our "Lenten offering" cards which we invite you to take home. For each of the 40 days of Lent there is a slot for you to put a quarter. You will be asked to return the cards on Easter Sunday. This is an opportunity we have to share our gifts with others and to teach our children about sharing and thinking of the less fortunate. The proceeds gathered will go toward Mustard Seed Communities and our Parish Food Pantry.
