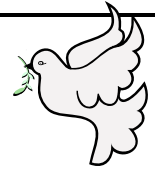

Easter Sunday

HOPE RESTORED

Today Christians around the world gather to celebrate the centrality of their faith—that the Lord Jesus suffered, died, and rose from the dead to bring new life to all who believe. What difference can Easter really make in our lives?

Any difference that Easter can bring can be summed up in one word: hope. Picture yourself as one of the followers of Jesus of Nazareth. The one for whom you had given up everything, the one in whom you had placed all your trust, the one who seemed to be the way to freedom from fear—this one had been put to death in the most horrifying way. He was nailed to a cross, and on that cross it seemed that hope itself breathed its last. Have you ever felt that way—that hope had breathed its last? For many who lose a cherished job, a spouse to death or divorce, a child to drug abuse or disease, there just doesn't seem to be any hope remaining. This was the kind of despair that Peter, John, and Mary of Magdala must have been feeling on that first day of the week.

EASTER: OUR OWN STORY

The Gospel story today is, in a nutshell, the story of our very own lives. It is a story of restored hope. Like those disciples, we must always, when in despair, see and believe that Jesus Christ rose from the dead. When we place our belief in the power of God to raise Jesus from the dead, we also place our belief in the power of God to deliver us from the death of despair, malaise, and hopelessness. This is at the heart of why we come to church this day. We look to the empty tomb to find hope that was lost. It is for this that we raise heart and voice in an endless “Alleluia!”

ESPERANZA RESTAURADA

Hoy, los cristianos de todo el mundo se reúnen para celebrar el aspecto central de su fe —que el Señor Jesús sufrió, murió y resucitó de entre los muertos para dar vida nueva a todos los que creen. ¿Qué diferencia puede hacer la Pascua en nuestra vida?

Todo lo que la Pascua puede traer se resume en una palabra: esperanza. Imagina que eres uno de los seguidores de Jesús de Nazaret, por el que renunciaste a todo, pusiste toda tu confianza y pensabas que te conduciría del miedo a la libertad —pero murió de la manera más horrible posible. Lo clavaron en una cruz, donde parecía que la esperanza misma dio su último suspiro. ¿Te has sentido así alguna vez —que la esperanza se acabó? Para muchos que perdieron un buen trabajo, su cónyuge por la muerte o el divorcio, un hijo por las drogas o la enfermedad, parece que ya no hay esperanza. Este tipo de desesperación deben haber sentido Pedro, Juan y María Magdalena el primer día de la semana.

PASCUA: NUESTRA PROPIA HISTORIA

La lectura del Evangelio es, en resumen, la historia de nuestra vida. Es una historia de la esperanza restaurada. Al igual que esos discípulos, cuando nos desesperamos debemos siempre ver y creer que Jesús resucitó de entre los muertos. Cuando creemos en el poder de Dios para resucitar a Jesús de entre los muertos, también creemos en su poder para librarnos de la desesperación, el malestar y la desesperanza. Esta es la razón por la que este día venimos a la iglesia. Miramos la tumba vacía para encontrar la esperanza perdida. Es por eso que levantamos nuestro corazón y nuestras voces en un interminable “¡Aleluya!”

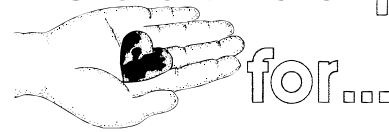
