MY SPIRITUAL JOURNEY

I have been attending St. Linus for the last nineteen years. Over this time period, my wife and I have been married, our children have been confirmed and a grandchild has been baptized here at St. Linus. All of this has occurred with myself not being a member of the Catholic Church.

I have been asked to write what has brought me to my decision to join the Catholic Church? My reason for doing so is that I know in my heart that this is what I should be doing. Since I was baptized a Christian over 50 years ago I have always considered myself a Christian. At times I would not claim to be the most devoted Christian, especially during the early part of my military career. Things changed for me some twenty years ago when I met my wife. That is when I started to attend the Catholic Church. At first it was a little hard to understand all the parts of the mass. After a while, I entered into an inquiry class at the military base I was stationed at. This only lasted a few months as I was nearing the end of my military career. It would be a few years later before I again decided to attend RCIA at St. Linus. While I was going through this, I always had questions in the back of my mind and was unsure that I should join the Catholic Church. Cur to these questions, I never completed this process.

The one thing that I did not do was stop going to church. For myself, it was not the messenger being important, but that it was the word of God. Over the years, St. Linus has become my shelter from the craziness of the outside world. When I enter the church I always receive a feeling that the presence of God is there and that I am safe.

As I reflect on my family during my childhood, God and church were always part of our life. Both my parents and grandparents were persons who lived their lives showing the world that they were Christians.

During the years of marriage to my wife, other than my wife, another big influence was my mother-in-law. Maybe I should not say an influence but rather a shining example of what it means to love God's word, learning to grow in faith and now am ready to receive all the benefits that the mass and fellowship with other members offer.

In my life I have been shown many instances of living the Christian life by others. I have recognized these signs and invitations from God. I'm not going to turn him down this time. I decided to enroll in RCIA again and this time have made becoming a member of St. Linus my goal.

MY SPIRITUAL JOURNEY

When asked the question of "What led you here?" I reflected upon many events in my life. This spiritual path was one my parents had set for me originally through their example and character. As a child i was baptized in the Methodist Church where my parents were active members and Sunday school teachers. My father believed strongly in character, integrity, dignity, and reverence and instilled these traits in my brother and me at every opportunity. Life changed dramatically for me at age twelve when my father was called to Heaven. I questioned why it had to be so and was left unsatisfied by the responses of others, including my church pastor. In short order, i stopped attending church as I felt more and more like an outsider looking in. even at home i felt strangely detached. This feeling stayed with me into adulthood.

When I felt outside of church during this time, I never felt outside of God's love. As an adult I Investigated numerous Christian churches but couldn't find a "fit". No matter how hard I *tried* to be comfortable, I couldn't make a connection. Somehow the perspective was never quite right. I didn't realize it at the time but what was missing was continuity.

Eventually, i met my wife Teresa, her mother and step father Bob Ricci. Bob was a man of great integrity, filled with love. A man truly blessed. If asked, he was the first to credit all his blessings to God. I greatly admired the relationship and home life he had encouraged me by both example and word to let faith be my guide in all things and not worry about *trying* to fit. "Faith is like a compass." With faith he said, God would lead me in the right direction, always. And it has. By letting go, I was led to a better relationship with my wife and her family, who invited me to share the beauty of Sunday Mass and the rich continuity of the Catholic Church.

Bob left this world in February 2004 and I started in RCIA , and firmly back on the spiritual trail, in the fall of that same year. Throughout the period of inquiry I was struck by a sense of belonging. This was the right fit. Throughout this process I have never felt lost or alone. I feel as I am home again.

Fifth Sunday of Lent

NOT FOR MY SAKE . . .

We struggle with the meaning of losing our life in order to find it, of dying in order to live. In the covenant of our world, these contradictory concepts make no sense. But Jesus came to establish a new covenant, one of service and of love. “He learned obedience from what he suffered” (Hebrews 5:8). “Obedience” and “suffering” are two much misunderstood concepts. To obey means to listen and take to heart. Jeremiah speaks of God’s law being written in our hearts, and that we will come to know our God. Psalm 51 cries out to God for “a clean heart,” for it is with a clear conscience and clear vision that we will see God’s will for us.

BUT FOR YOURS

Just as the prophets and the psalms proclaimed the true way to know and follow God, Jesus shows us in his teaching and in his life how we are to love and serve God and each other. The letter to the Hebrews speaks of Jesus’ reverence for God that manifested itself in obedience and suffering, not for its own sake, but for ours and for the glory of God. This mutual love of God and humanity is made perfect in Jesus, and we begin to see how our suffering can serve others and give glory to God. Our work and our prayer are to be for the good of all, not just for our own benefit: “I will draw everyone to myself” (John 12:32). Jesus’ goodness and his sacrifice attract us to him and show us the enormity of his love and care for us. He held nothing back that could help us find God.

“Where I am, there also will my servant be” (John 12:26). We look to Jesus for our help in loving God and each other, in giving glory to God and service to others. Our glory and honor lie in serving God and our neighbor with love and reverence.
