In a parent, the following signs may signal the presence of child abuse or neglect: Shows little concern for the child, Blames the child for the child's problems in school or at home, Asks teachers or other caretakers to use harsh physical discipline if the child misbehaves, Sees the child as entirely bad, worthless, or burdensome. eco-palms: harvest for justice

*They took palm branches and went out to meet him
and cried out "Hosanna! Blessed is he
who comes in the name of the Lord!"*

John 12:12-13

In our celebration of Palm Sunday, the Catholic Community of St. Linus Church has partnered with Catholic Relief Services Fair Trade to use eco-palms—a branch truly worthy of praising our God.

indigenous communities at risk

More than 300 million palm fronds are harvested each year for U.S. consumption alone—most of them for Palm Sunday. Yet for the communities who harvest these plants year after year, palm fronds rarely represent jubilation. Although U.S. palm purchases may reach as high as \$4.5 million each year, the palm harvesters themselves earn very little. Indigenous families and communities, who rely heavily on palm harvesting for income, represent the poorer segments of the rural populations in the palm-producing areas of Mexico and Guatemala.

environment at risk

Typically, palm harvesting is done by community members hired by local contractors, who then sell palms to large floral export firms. Payment is based on volume, so harvesters are motivated to gather a large quantity of palms without regard for quality. As a result, up to half the palms harvested are usually discarded due to poor quality. Many palm producing areas are important biosphere reserves, and the harsh harvesting techniques are rapidly depleting the forest's rich biodiversity.

harvest for justice

Catholic Relief Services has partnered with Lutheran World Relief to help build support in the U.S. for eco-palms by introducing parishes to this social and environmental justice project and as a way to walk humbly with the Lord in justice and right (Micah 6:8).

Eco-palms are harvested in a more sustainable way—harvesters are paid on the quality of their palms rather than the quantity. These communities are also committed to using harvesting practices that minimize the impact on the natural forest.

Eco-palm harvesters and community members sort and package the palms themselves and sell their palms directly rather than relying on middlemen. In this way, eco-palms improve local communities' standard of living and ensure that the money paid for the palms benefit those who labor.

As we raise our branches today for Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem, we play an important role in protecting forests, local jobs, and sustainable livelihoods in harvesting communities.

eco-palms: cosecha justa

Entonces tomaron ramos de palma y salieron a su encuentro gritando: "Hosanna! Bendito el que viene en nombre del Señor!" Juan 12:12-13

En nuestra celebración de Domingo de Ramos, la Comunidad Católica de San Lino se ha asociado con Catholic Relief Services Fair Trade para usar ecopalmas– una palma digna para la alabanza de nuestro Dios.

comunidades indígenas en riesgo

Más de 300 millones de hojas de palma son cosechadas cada año para el consumo en Estados Unidos solamente – la gran mayoría para el domingo de Ramos. Sin embargo, para las comunidades que recogen estas hojas todos los años, las palmas rara vez representan un momento de júbilo. Aun cuando las compras de palmas en USA pueden alcanzar hasta \$4.5 millones al año, los cosechadores de la palma reciben muy poco en compensación. Familias y comunidades indígenas, que dependen de la cosecha de la palma para sobrevivir, representan los segmentos más pobres de las poblaciones rurales en las zonas productoras de palma de México y Guatemala.

medio ambiente en riesgo

La cosecha de la palma es típicamente hecha por miembros de la comunidad, empleados por contratistas locales, que luego venden las palmas a grandes firmas de exportación de flores. El pago se basa en el volumen, por lo que los cosechadores están motivados a reunir la mayor cantidad de palmas, sin importar mucho la calidad. Esto resulta en que hasta la mitad de las palmas cosechadas sean rechazadas por calidad pobre. Muchas zonas de producción de palma son reservas importantes de la biosfera, y las exigentes técnicas de cosecha están consumiendo rápidamente esta rica fuente de biodiversidad de los bosques.

cosecha justa

Catholic Relief Services Fair Trade se ha asociado con Lutheran World Relief para promover apoyo a las eco-palmas en USA, presentando a las parroquias este proyecto de justicia social y ambiental y como una forma de caminar humildemente con el Señor en justicia y bondad (Miqueas 6:8).

Las eco-palmas son cosechadas de una manera más ecológicamente sostenible – los cosechadores son compensados por calidad de las palmas más que por la cantidad. Estas comunidades están comprometidas también con usar prácticas para la cosecha que minimicen el impacto en los bosques naturales.

Los cosechadores de eco-palma y miembros de sus comunidades seleccionan y empaquetan las palmas ellos mismos, y venden las palmas directamente, sin intermediarios. De esta manera, las eco-palmas ayudan a mejorar el nivel de vida de las comunidades y aseguran que el dinero pagado por las palmas beneficia a aquellos que hacen la labor.

Hoy, al levantar nuestras palmas para la celebrar la entrada triunfal de Jesús en Jerusalén, jugamos un papel importante en la protección de los bosques, empleos locales y el desarrollo sostenible de la vida de las comunidades involucradas en la cosecha.

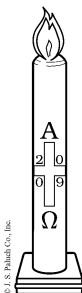
