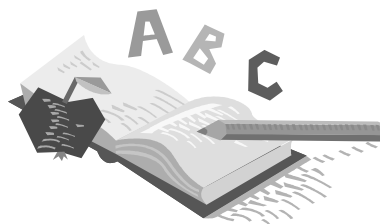

**The State of California and Same-Sex Marriage
The Bishops of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles
June 16, 2008**

The Catholic Bishops of the United States have affirmed repeatedly that persons with a homosexual orientation “must be accepted with respect, compassion, and sensitivity.”^o Accordingly the Bishops condemn all forms of violence, scorn, and hatred—whether subtle or overt—against men and women who are homosexual. All people, regardless of sexual inclination, are called to holiness; and “should be encouraged to take an active role in the faith community” and to live according to its teachings.¹

Nonetheless, the Church cannot approve of redefining marriage, which has a unique place in God’s creation, joining a man and a woman in a committed relationship in order to nurture and support the new life for which marriage is intended. The meaning of marriage is deeply rooted in history and culture, and has been shaped considerably by Christian tradition. Its meaning is given, not constructed. “When marriage is redefined so as to make other relationships equivalent to it, the institution of marriage is devalued and further weakened.”²

The state has a primary and fundamental obligation to protect and promote the family, which is rooted in marriage and sustained by it.

Some benefits currently sought by same sex partners can already be obtained without regard to marital status. For example, individuals can agree to own property jointly with another, and they can generally designate anyone they choose to be a beneficiary of their will or to make health care decisions in case the become incompetent.³ Other desired benefits such as sharing in a partner’s health insurance could be made available without the drastic step of a cultural or legal redefinition or marriage.

Let us strengthen our resolve to respect the dignity of each human being and to protect the sanctity of marriage, asking God’s guidance in our efforts to promote the common good central to a free and democratic society.

Youth Ministry/LIFE TEEN

LIFE Nights are catechetical meetings that immediately follow the Youth Mass on Sunday evening from 7:15 - 8:45 PM and take place in the parish hall unless otherwise noted. Teens in preparation for confirmation are expected to attend most nights.

We will resume with summer activities starting in July. As always ALL HS teens are invited to attend. Graduating 8th graders are all welcome to attend LIFE nights and start building community within youth ministry.

This is a great opportunity to start making relationships with peers and leaders in youth ministry before you even enter high school.

Come and See

At the heart of ministry to teens here at St. Linus is the Eucharist. If the Eucharist is the heart then relationships are the circulatory system. Faithful caring adults are needed to enter into relationships with the youth of the parish and our community to help build a comprehensive ministry to teenagers. If it takes a village to raise a child – it takes an entire faith community to foster the faith of young people.

LIFE TEEN is constantly in need of adults to help in ministry on the leadership team, in liturgy, as confirmation catechists, prayer partners, host families for small group meetings, and people who are interested in simply being a regular presence to youth at ministry activities.

All adults of St. Linus are invited to a "come and see/information" night on Wednesday, June 25 from 7-8:45 PM, to learn more about LIFE TEEN and the vision of ministry at our parish. Come meet teens and those currently serving in ministry and perhaps even find opportunities to respond to your baptismal call to serve.

There is no obligation to the ministry by attending this meeting. Refreshments will be provided. Feel free to extend this invitation to others. Older brothers and sisters make great leaders and parents are encouraged to continue their involvement in the life of their teenager. For anyone who cares about teenagers, there is no one too old for youth ministry we will find a place for you in ministry.

Youth Ministry/Confirmation

Registration materials for recent 8th grade graduates and any other teens wishing to enter Phase 1 of confirmation preparation have been mailed this week and are available in the youth ministry display by the side door of the church. Teens interested in confirmation preparation must first register for youth ministry. Candidates returning to phase two of the process will also receive registration in the mail. For complete registration a copy of the baptismal certificate, a current photo of the teen, \$75 yearly fee, and the completed registration form must all be returned together by August 10, 2008.

Give the Gift of LIFE

It seems like there is always a summer blood shortage. Why? Because nearly 20 percent of the blood donated at American Red Cross blood drives each year comes from high school and college students. And during the summer, students break from school and families take vacations - and few people end up donating. Unfortunately, the patients in our hospitals don't get to take a vacation. Currently there is less than a 24-hour supply of B-Negative blood and less than a 48-hour supply of A-Negative blood, but people with all blood types are encouraged to donate.

When you make your list of summer plans, please include a blood donation. One hour of your summer could help save 3 lives. If you are eligible, please call 1-800-GIVE-LIFE (1-800-448-3543) or visit givelife.org to make your next life-saving appointment. Anyone at least 17 years old (age 16 with written parental consent), weighing 110 pounds or more, and feeling in good health may be eligible to donate blood.
